This is the story of a very unique olive oil... made with olives collected from the Smrikva Bowl „seeds of the Legends“ Olive Trees... it is the story of a magic Heritage Olive Oil...



... if you have your Olive Tree growing in Smrikve, planted during your Smrikva Bowl, and like to spend time in nature, I am pleased to share that for the end of October 2025 there will be the opportunity to join us during our olives harvest season... it is a wonderful time to feel the smell and taste of our fresh olive oil... it is time to enjoy some inspiring stories during our resting times... and it is an active autumn outdoor holiday opportunity to feel the connection with nature and live some new experiences...

What makes Smrikva Bowl „seeds of the Legends“ Olive Oil story unique?

Since Roman Empire times Istria was known as the land of prestige olive oil for its quality... it was the economy created by the olive oil that built the Arena in Pula... and today Istria continues to be the land of some of the most prestige olive oils in the world...



... Smrikva Bowl Olive Oil story is a story of a top quality olive groves nurtured with passion but is also a unique story for something that change our trees stories on daily basis...

Back in 2004, a father of a Smrikva Bowl player suggested that we should plant during Smrikva Bowl an olive tree... I liked the idea because I felt the olive tree story is in line with Smrikva Bowl DNA... and I thought since the beginning that we should plant an old olive tree every year...

For the first planting ceremony I found over 150 years old olive tree from Spain... I will explain a bit later why the message of planting an old olive tree was important to me...

It was 30th of June 2005, the 10th Smrikva Bowl anniversary, when we started this magnificent story... we started to plant an old Olive tree as part of the Smrikva Bowl Ambassador's Nomination Ceremony... and today we can count on 20 „seeds of the Legends“ Olive Trees generations... those trees were planted by 2000 SB seeds spread in 111 country...

On the picture below you can see Donna Vekic, silver Olympic medalist, back in 2005... you can see Donna while planting her generation olive tree... while planting a tree the kids make a wish and donate their name to the tree...

... and this picture was taken exactly the day when this magic story started... I am pleased to have Donna on the picture for an additional story that I am pleased to share...

Years ago I learned that Donna celebrate her birthday the same day when we played the first day of the first Smrikva Bowl... 28th of June 1996... and since I learned that everytime I see Donna I think how would Smrikva Bowl look like if it was a woman...



... in 2003 I bought a small vineyard in the valley of Smrikve... and our family vineyard is exactly nearby the vineyard my grandfather Mate Bencic (Matteo Benci) planted back in 1957 when he moved his family to Smrikve... in 2005, we started to bottle and donate to each player's family a collection bottle of our Malmsey wine... most of the years we bottled 375 ml in size, with a special hope to recall the bottles one day when some of the SB seeds from that generation win a Grand Slam event...

I kept repeating to players and families the story how this bottles will turn prestige one day because of the results obtained by them... and this is becoming more and more true as you will discover... the Grand Slam collections for so many generation bottles keep increasing year after year...

In 2006... during the Olive Tree ceremony... we prepared for the first time for players another gift that was given to them during the ceremony... a small collection olive oil bottles... since then each Smrikva Bowl seed brought home one small bottle... this is today also traditional part of the Smrikva Bowl Ambassador's nomination ceremony...



We keep this tradition and keep donating each Smrikva Bowl kid with special bottle and indication of their generation year... I am always happy to hear from families stories of how special this olive oil is for their children...

Both our wine & olive oil gift bottles are very limited collections per edition... just between 90 and 150 pieces per year... always in line with the number of families we can invite plus some bottles to donate to close Smrikve friends... and it is thanks to the stories that our “seeds of the Legends” are writing that our olive oil and wine drops are turning into unique one... today there are 2000+ life stories part of our legendary trees stories...

Thanks to the Smrikva Bowl seeds our olive oil and wine have reached 111 countries ... and I am sure that if there was a possibility to ask AI to let us know in how many places on our planet a family courtyard with limited number of vitus and olive trees can count on the fact of having their olive oil and wine drops spread into 111 countries and six continents... I believe AI would have difficulties to name a place a part of naming our Smrikve valley and gardens...

We have a small family vineyard... and we have small number of olive trees... but are honored to know that wine and olive oil from this small piece of land touched so many different countries and can count on such an important tennis track record that grows on daily basis...



The Olive tree selected are traditionally older then our players and the age of the tree is a symbol of intergenerational responsibility.

Every person is born without knowing anything about life on this earth and it is the responsibility of every generation to understand and to learn to preserve all that each of us is born with.

When I think of our old olive trees I like to think of the Lion King cartoon story when Mufasa was explaining to Simba that is not easy to be the King... a good King should know that everything around us lives in a delicate equilibrium and with intelligence we should try to understand it and respect it. The intergenerational responsibility alone will allow future generations to enjoy the beauty of life, the sunsets and the seasons of the earth.



On 26th of March 2009, after 18 months of full time work, „Istria from Smrikve“ cultural heritage book was published on line... that was the year when the creation of Smrikva Bowl Library started...

„Istria from Smrikve“ was created with idea to start the cultural tourism development in Istria... and attract travelers interested in discovering new cultures and new places... a bigger dream behind that idea is to support the stories of farmers and their olive oil and wine making traditions...

I grew up on my grandparents farm in Smrikve... I worked on fields and helped my grandparents and our large family to take care of the animals and land we cultivated in Smrikve... I know how passionate you must be to stay in contact with the land and soil every day... if you do it during your childhood it is likely that you will develop a kind of love for the smell of the fresh cut grass... and also feel the joy in sweating on a hot sunny day working on the fields...

... while creating this virtual cultural book I believed that in the long run it may help some wine and olive oil makers of Istria... those are people that on daily basis take care of the land... and I knew that to make this idea real I will need help of our Smrikva Bowl seeds... they have their olive trees planted during Smrikva Bowl growing at Smrikve... we nurture and take care of them... but one day our seeds might be capable of giving voice to the beauty of this story...



I kept thinking how to make this dream true... and in March 2019... there were already 14 generations olive trees growing in Smrikve... I realized that after 14 years of planting our old olive trees it was time to add another dot... and start bottling some super special limited olive oil collections with aim to make it a tradition... and search for the best way to share the story with our seeds that the very special olive oil is now made from those olive trees we keep planting together...

I thought if this can become a tradition it would also make it more easy to measure on yearly basis the growth of our living fairy tale keep evolving on daily basis because of our seeds... their tennis rackets skills keep creating entertainment for over 1 billion people all around the world...

How is all that connected?

By making our trees story special and legendary... „Istria from Smrikve“ story would get known too... and both cultural tourism and olive oil and wine makers families from Istria might shine thanks to Smrikva Bowl seeds in the long run...

Being Istrian olive oil very limited in quantities I thought that if the top world restaurants get encouraged to have on their tables some of the best Istrian olive oils and wines this would help a lot of families... and this was among my dreams behind dedicating so many hours to create this cultural e-book... that each family I mention in my book can live with honor from their work...

... back in 2019 there were over 1440 SB seeds who had their olive trees growing in our courtyard... there were 1440 stories to share...

To make traditional the idea above I was thinking that every year we should bottle a limited collection of numbered bottles... and the final decision was taken to bottle our golden drops into 200 ml squared bottles which had just enough space to display some words that I wished to be written on the bottles...

... filled in with the golden colour of our olive oil the bottles started to remind me the neo classic look of a luxury Bulgari perfume...

The second idea was related with the number of bottles that we should bottle every year...

I thought that should be exactly equal to the number of generations olive trees living in Smrikve at the date when the collection bottles are bottled... so every year after planting a new tree we will increase the number of collection bottles by one bottle...

...and another important part was also to determine what should be written on each annual bottle...

... I knew that I wished to number each bottle... but I also knew that at the back of the bottle I should display some key summary facts representing the combined track record of Smrikva Bowl seeds in relation to their tennis game results...



Children who planted our olive trees are the one who are making them special... with their tennis rackets and with their tennis life stories... on and off the court stories does matter to me... and each

tree today has many stories to share... and this is one of the reasons why our olive oil and wine story is unique...



... in March 2019, there were in total over 1930 SB seeds spread in 87 countries and 6 continents..... since we started to plant our olive trees in 2005 there were 1440 names & 14 generations olive trees... and I wished to take into account also this distinction and present it on the bottles...



... therefore... on the first collection cube bottles of 200 ml was written the following:

Smrikva Bowl was founded in 1996 and over 1930 players from 87 countries and 6 continents participated so far. In 2005 Smrikva Bowl players started to plant olive trees. 14 generations (over 1440 players) have their olive tree in Smrikve.

As of 18/03/2019, their track record* is:

- 30 (**23**) junior Grand Slam titles conquered by 23 (17) players
- 30 (13) professional ATP/WTa titles
- 45 (31) players reached TOP 200 ATP/WTa ranking & 21 (15) players reached TOP 100 ATP/WTa ranking
- 150+ (100+) players received scholarships to study in the US

Note – In brackets: 14 olive trees generations track record

I put the note which explain that in brackets you will find the track record of the kids who planted the olive trees out of the total track record numbers obtained by all the SB seeds together...

By sensing how special this story will be in the long run I decided also to find a way to assign a symbolic value to our collection bottles... more and more I am convinced that this will become the measurement of the prestige reached by our trees and its fruits... and I thought to link the symbolic value of each bottle to the Grand Slam titles conquered by Smrikva Bowl seeds at the time when the bottles are bottled...

... to give you an idea of that first collection bottle symbolic value... being the starting measurement related to 200 ml volume... and being the starting Grand Slam combined number of the Grand Slam titles conquered by those players who had their trees growing in Smrikve equal to 23... the value was 23 at the time...



Since the first collection bottles we were tracking Grand Slam events conquered in total, and in particular by the seeds who planted our olive trees.... but I decided to track also professional

ATP/WTa titles which is always significant and difficult to achieve... I also indicated the number of players who reached Top 200 ATP/WTa ranking and Top 100 ATP/WTa ranking which is very difficult to achieve... people who either played professional tennis or are following tennis with passion for years can understand the real hurdle of climbing the ATP/WTa mountain towards the peak limits of Top 100 ATP/WTa...

... there is another element that was significant to me... this one is related with the number of players who got scholarship to study in the US thanks to their tennis and academic skills...

...if you are able to get the scholarship in the US it means that you dedicated at least 7.000-8.000+ quality working hours in developing your tennis skills by the age of 17...

Above you can read all these data indicated on the track record of the bottles we bottled in spring 2019... and it is a an impressive exercise to observe how all the details indicated on this first bottle continued to change over time...



Grand Slam events are the most prestige gatherings in the game of tennis and winning either junior or senior title is a great honor for the player, family and coaches...

... and you will learn in the following that some new achievements were added over the years...

As I wrote the first collection bottle symbolic value was 23... equal to 23 Grand Slam titles collected at the time by the children who planted our olive trees... despite the total Grand Slam titles was at the time 30 because 7 titles were conquered by the seeds who played Smrikva Bowl before 2005...

I expected that year after year this number would have increased... but I did not know exactly how fast this will be knowing how challenging is to lift a Grand Slam title...

... over the years the seeds kept actually impressing me... and they went many times beyond my imagination...



... there are over a million registered tennis players in a generation on our planet and there are just four Grand Slam events in a year... I always believed in SB seeds and I knew that these bottles will represent kind of photo frame in time, a picture of a living fairy tale story that is written on daily basis in so many countries around the world...

Being all the collection bottles numbered and in homes of SB friends I wished to keep the record in which family is located each numbered bottle... and since the first collection was made all the bottles are tracked...

... I learned over the years that you can never thanks enough those willing to believe in your story and willing to support your dreams... and I am always super happy when year after year there is at

least one new friend who fall in love with the story of Smrikve and give us that encouragement that can inspire us and help us to continue to spread and develop our story...

It was spring 2022 when we bottled our second limited collection... at the time there were over 2220 Smrikva Bowl players part of the Smrikva Bowl family spread in 98 countries and 6 continents... and that year we bottled 17 collection bottles representing 17 generations which trees were growing in Smrikve at the time...

As you may notice there was a jump from 14 when we started this story to 17 when we continued the story... why this happened?

Smrikva Bowl was founded in 1996 and our olive tree planting tradition during Smrikva Bowl started in 2005...



It is true that so far 20 generations (over 2000 players) have their olive tree planted in Smrikve... but there are two generations 25th and 26th generation that did not play their events due to covid 19 pandemic...



Those two generations also have their trees living in Smrikve... despite the two editions were not held each player who passed the Smrikva Bowl selection process during pandemic received the Smrikva Bowl Ambassador title and have their generation dedicated olive tree living in Smrikve...

We re started the tradition in spring 2022 when the possibilities to gather became possible again... and this is the reason why there was a jump from 14 collection bottles to **17 collection bottles**...



The 2nd Heritage Smrikva Bowl collection bottles had inscribed on it the following:

As of 04/04/2022, Smrikva Bowl seeds track record* is:

- 60 (38) professional ATP/WTa titles (1 Grand Slam title) conquered by 21 (16) player
- 37 (**30**) Grand Slam titles conquered by 29 (22) players
- 1 (1) Olympic golden medal (singles) & 1 (1) Olympic silver medal (doubles)
- 1 (1) NEXT GEN ATP Finals title
- 57 (42) players reached TOP 200 ATP/WTa ranking & 33 (24) players reached TOP 100 ATP/WTa ranking
- 12 (11) players reached #1 ITF ranking
- 250+ (200+) players received scholarships to study in the US

If you compare the numbers of the 1st and 2nd collection bottle you will notice an increase in all the comparable data... in addition, we started to track the Olympic medals, Next Gen ATP titles and the players who reached #1 ITF ranking...

... to give you an idea of the symbolic donation value growth... the 200 ml of the heritage value bottle was at the time equal to 30... because of 7 new Grand Slam titles...

If you compare the numbers of the 4th and future 5th collection bottle, you will notice again a significant increase...

... 200 ml of the heritage symbolic value is equal to 44... because of 5 new Grand Slam titles...

... *how amazing is that!...*

In 2025 we decided to make two new heritage collection lines for the first time for the new seeds that are going to visit the Smrikva Bowl theater for the 30th annual and we prepared 30 numbered heritage collection bottles of 250 ml with certificate representing the 30 Smrikva Bowl editions...



... and we prepared 10 numbered heritage collection bottles of 500 ml with certificate representing the peak of the ITF/ATP/WTa mountains... Top 10 ITF/ATP/WTa level is the level where chances to collect the Grand Slam title increase...



The request was so huge that we had to prepare the 2nd edition of two series...

The 6th collection bottles series, limited to 21 bottles, to be bottled in spring 2026, is expected to have inscribed on it at least the following:

Istria is very close to Italy... and for approximately six centuries Istria was part of the Roman Empire... and for almost six centuries big part of Istria was part of the Venice Republic... and these two civilizations nurtured wine making tradition and left traces on our family wine making culture too...

Today in Italy you can still find almost 350 different types of vitus... with so many different grapes many different wines you can make... in addition good wines are usually structured so the combinations you can get is statistically huge...

In our family we do two types of wines for our family use... one is white and one is red... our white wine is made mostly from Malmsey grapes (Malvasia Istriana)... and this was the preferred wine of my grandfather...

When my family decided to build our first tennis court we did not have enough land to build it and my grandfather agreed to take out some vitus already planted and give us the necessary land to fit our first tennis court into our property... we took away those vitus but our collection bottles from that same valley via tennis reached 111 countries so far... tennis & wine story combined in a bottle...

... historically... the story of our white wine is closely linked to the Venice Republic heritage...



Malmsey grapes arrived to Istria from Greece thanks to Venice Republic... the origin of Malmsey vitus is from Monemvasia... a small town in Greece... Venetians were famous traders and they made this wine very popular in all Europe for around couple of centuries...

... by having created a huge demand for this particular type of wine they planted a lot of Malmsey vineyards on the biggest Greek island - Crete... but when Crete Island become part of the Ottoman Empire they moved part of the vitus of Malmsey to the friendly regions of the Republic... and Istria was at the time part of the Venice Republic... this mostly happened at the end of the 16th century...

... during my childhood Malvasia was still the most famous type of a white wine traditionally cultivated in Istria... it is a dry white wine... has a nice pale golden colour... scent is youthful and subtle, with complex fragrance... you can feel and smell multiple layers that can associate your memory to various natural experiences you lived... and almost every family living in the countryside is still nurturing this type of vitus and wine in Istria...

Recently I learned that also among the preferred wines of Leonardo Da Vinci was Malvasia Candia...



Being vitus a very delicate plant... if you do not dedicate time to it after couple of years you could easily loose your vineyard and its fruits...

Our red wine story... is also a special story that reminds me the love and peace story... this is inscribed in the name that was given to our red wine... „Angvšta“ ... it may look and sound strange to you at first... but... let me share the following story with you...

...when I decided to name it Angvšta I did it because in this name I can still hear my grandfather and grandmother voice... this is how we call in Istrian dialect the month of August... my grandparents married on 15th of August 1940 and were lucky to celebrate 50 years of marriage in 1990... the western readers of this note might be familiar after whom August month was named... those knowing the story when they hear August their thoughts might turn towards the Roman Empire period because August was actually named after Emperor Augustus... if you are familiar with this fact you might be also familiar with the fact that July was named after Gens Julia family... and the history of the town where Smrikva Bowl is held have links with this family and its story...

... the readers might not be familiar that Emperor Augustus was married for 51 year with Livia Drusilla (Julia Augusta)... and Julia Augusta had an important influence on Emperor Augustus over their five decades long marriage... and probably had an impact on what could be described today as Pax Augustea... love and peace story... *but what all that had to do with our red wine?...*

... there is a story, apparently documented by Plinio the Elder, which wrote that the first Roman Emperor's wife Livia Drusilla - Julia Augusta appreciated Istrian wine... this note was saying: “Julia Augusta (Livia Drusilla) lived to her 87 years of age by merit of the wine Pucinum; and drinking only

that wine, whose grape grows in the Hadrian's Bay, not far from the spring of Timavo, on a rocky hill..."

On the place of current Sovinjak there was a Roman fortress named Pucinum and thanks to Plinio the Elder and Livia Drusilla we can assume that the wine described could have been Istrian origin wine or not really far away from this place... and if this is true and if it was drunk by Emperor family should have been very good at the time but we do not know which type of grape could have been made of...

Our second wine we do is made of 7 types of red grapes and as I wrote above I named it Angvšta... after reading an inspiring book named „Roma Caput Vini“ I kept thinking that there might be a very small probability that the DNA of vitus we use to make our Angvšta could have been used at the time of Livia Drusilla too... the probability is very remote but the story is still nice...

We use mostly Teran but in limited quantities there are also Merlot, Refosc, some unknown old type of vitus, and few new type of vitus for Istria and another grape from the east...



During our breaks you will have the opportunity to taste both our Malvazija and Angvšta... and there is no other places in the world where you can taste them...

The same as our olive oil story also our vineyard story keep growing because of our SB seeds...

... after this introduction... it is time to return to our Smrikva Bowl Olive Harvest Family Week plan and program...

When we usually harvest our olives?

Most of the time the harvest period is related with the moment when our olives get ripen and this is related with the overall weather conditions during that year...

The earlier harvest we started was around 10th of October and the latest around 10th of November... but traditionally the peak time is the last week of October... and our harvest family week will be scheduled in 2025 for that week and will include at least two week ends...



How many families we can select for this holiday opportunity - Smrikva Bowl Olives Harvest Family Week 2025?

Maximum at the moment would be up to eight families...



How many harvest days we need to collect our olives?

It depends on the year... the shortest was 3 full days... and the longest was seven full days... all performed with larger teams... but for the SBOHFW we foresee one collection day for 21 SB seeds trees...



I am pleased to share in the following what we do during our harvest day... to help you understand what you could expect in terms of physical outdoor activity related with the harvest process...

Please remember to get dressed properly... it should be farming clothes... and despite it can be hot on sunny days our mornings during that period might have dew and proper working cloths and shoes are mandatory...

How is a typical harvest day organized:



We usually prepare our olive trees fields several days and weeks in advance... we keep the grass a bit lower to avoid that the morning dew disturb us in the harvest preparation process... if there is a dew the harvest can not start till the eventual dew is not fully dry on the leaves of the trees but we can place the nets even with dew with proper waterproof shoes...

Placing the nets (7:00 AM – 8:30 AM)

We usually start to place and position our harvest nets very early... when the sunrise... between 7:00 AM – 8:30 AM... and if there is a dew thanks to having our grass cut we can perform this activity but proper waterproof shoes are always required for this activity...



Placing the nets is a very important part for the collection model that we follow...

We have various forms of nets and our fields are not all perfectly shaped therefore a bit of creativity and play is always required to cover all the grounds with nets being many of our trees also decorative garden trees...



This work can be compared to a patchwork... and considering the size of the nets that we have the best performance is obtained if at least four people are working together in managing this key preparation part... by keeping the four corners of the nets it is more easy to manage and place them properly being many nets of important size in terms of length...

Harvesting process (8:30 AM - 11:00 AM – 11:30 AM - 2:30 PM)

We usually start to harvest our olives around 8:30 AM... and the major role in taking down the olives from the trees in our olive fields is electric harvesters stick... this device is specifically designed for this type of work...



We usually use during collection days between five and six electric harvesters sticks... but in case of bigger teams we could use even more...

They are designed to help us harvest the olives... and a short training will be done with each family member that will be trying this activity to learn the most efficient and effective techniques which will avoid that you get tired and eventually get the inflammation of shoulder muscles... proper technique also avoid eventual damages to the stick...

It is important to wear a cap and protection glasses to protect your eyes and head while the olives are falling down...

... and if you like to play computer games it is easy to use your imagination and imagine while harvesting that you are playing the game... the objective is to take down the olives of all the colours you spot...

Another important element to execute properly this task is balance and patience...

Once you are in a position you can keep that position for minutes in terms of balance... and your head is usually oriented towards the upper part of the tree... it is important not to move your feet while looking upwards because most of the olives that you already put down on the ground will be

crushed by your feet... so after you have cleaned the area of the tree you are harvesting you look down and move your feet on the net avoiding to step on olives and re start the process...

... as I wrote you start harvesting one brunch of the olive tree... and you play around... everything you do must be gentle and should not be done by force... if you can not reach certain olives from one angle there is always a proper angle from which you can reach them...

Usually the weather is nice during our harvest days and sometime you might be looking towards the sun and you will see too little... in that situation you have to move and change the angle in order to see properly where your action is directed...

In addition the color of the olive trees leaves are of two types of green... the outside or upper part of the leave is a darker green colour while inside is a lighter green... after you finish to harvest the tree from the outside... one of the team members have to step in towards the center of the tree... and there will be noticed the remaining olives thanks to the lighter colour of the leaves from the inside part...

An important advice to save your shoulder muscles is to keep the stick close to your body therefore it is always close to your center of gravity and your body muscles does not need to do any major effort... you can always also place lower part of the stick on the ground and direct the upper part towards the tree being our sticks of different dimensions and can be extended up to 2,2 meters or even 2,8 meters...

Electric harvesters sticks are below 3 kg of weight which is not a lot but improper holding for a longer period of time could let you feel the weight of it and for this reason the proper technique is of help... for each person that will qualify for this part of the work will be given the proper instructions and a small training will be organized to facilitate the new team entry with this activity...

... so far we used batteries to activate the electric harvesters sticks and it is important not to invert the cables while connecting to the battery to avoid that fuse blows... and in case there are more than one harvesting stick connected to one battery it is important to be aware of what is going on with your cable to avoid eventual damages that can happen on the battery by pulling the cable too much...

This part of the activity of taking down the olives from the trees is usually completed by 2:00 PM in order to perform other relevant activities related with the harvesting process and get the olives to the mill before the sunset which in that period of the year is quite early... around 5 PM...



... every time we are harvesting in Smrikve we usually have at 11:00 AM - 11:30 AM what is called „marenda“ which is a kind of brunch for the whole team... and after the major work is done around 2:30 PM we have the team lunch...



... but let me return to other tasks that the harvesting teams perform before the lunch time...

Collecting the olives from the nets

By 2:00 PM there is another important part of the process which most of the time start about one hour after we start the harvesting process and is completed by the second team which is dedicated to collect the olives from the nets... this part is very similar to the way fishing with the nets is traditionally performed...



... the olives get placed into plastic containers that can contain 25kg of olives... which are collected and brought for preliminary cleaning from the leaves before they are brought to the mill...



Folding the nets

The same team that was collecting the olives from the nets in teams of two or ideally four people start to fold the and tie the nets... this is again very similar to blanket folding process...



After the nets are folded and tied we transport them into the storage place because it is important that at night the nets are not outdoor because during that period of the year there is always dew during the night...

Plastic containers with 25kg of olives each... are transported to the place where the cleaning team will separate the eventual leaves from the olives...



Part of the team is also dedicated to make sure that the branches that were eventually cut during the harvesting process are brought out from the olive groves...

Cleaning the leaves (2:30 PM – 4:30 PM)

Cleaning the leaves is done with a team of four to five people at least with a help of machine... and the cleaned olives in the plastic containers of 25 kg are placed on the trailer or truck that is used to bring them to the mill...



Bring olives to the mill before sunset (4:30 PM and 5:00 PM)

Usually the day always finish by brining the harvested olives to the mill which get processed maximum within 24 hours from the arrival to the mill...





We always did the harvesting process within our family, close relatives and family friends and the eight - nine families that will be selected to spend their autumn holidays with us might enjoy the process the same way we enjoy it during the selected collection day...



I forget to mention that there is always also a place in our kitchen team because during harvest days we have always „marenda“ - brunch and lunch prepared...

As you can read above the harvest days are long days... they start at 7:00 AM for the part of the team and they finish late in the evening for another part of the team... with great and well trained teams we need at least seven+ full harvesting days on a good year...

Your experience during the SBOHFW will be tailored according to your physical possibilities and skills and during your stay we will collect for sure the 21 Smrikva Bowl generation olive trees... it takes a full day to collect with a good team 21 big trees...

The remaining part of the olive harvest family week will be structured as SMRIKVA BOWL TENNIS TALENTS FAMILY WEEK - (SBTTFW)...

SBTTFW is a unique long term impact development holiday experience for Smrikva Bowl children and their families initiated in 2015 by Mio, Smrikva Bowl - „La Bottega“ di Smrikve founder, and Luca Appino, Tennis Talents founder.

Mio & Luca are friends for over 20 years and share the same passion for the game of tennis... they share the curiosity to constantly study the evolution of the game, observe, and have the possibility to continuously exchange their findings and experiences on yearly basis... their vision of the tennis game constant evolution and their vision of the importance of the family in the process were the inspiration behind starting this unique holiday experience...

The players able to manage the momentum are usually named by others mentally tough players.

Tennis matches are not won by the players with the nicest looking strokes but by those who do not beat themselves. For many players toughest competition does not come from the player standing on the opposite side of the net but rather from the opponent located between our ears. We can call the opponent located between our ears the “dark side of tennis”. When the things do not go our way, the „dark side of tennis“ springs to life and uses his weapons – impatience, anger and fear – to take over our minds and destroy our game!

PEAK PERFORMANCE:

Spontaneous performance occurs only when the mind is calm and seems to be at one with the body. This process does not have to be learned; we already know it. It is similar to the process we used to learn to walk and talk. All that is needed is to unlearn those habits which interfere with peak performance and then just let it happen.

Development of inner skills is required to learn how to focus your attention and how to trust in yourself. The skill of mastering the art of effortless concentration is invaluable in whatever you set your mind to.

At Tennis-Talents (TT) you will find focus on young, high level oriented players. TT guide a player and his/her family on the path to professional tennis helping to define the best possible individual project.

Luca started his carrier in Italy and for over 10 years was dedicated to the development of tennis schools in various clubs. He has experience in management and marketing working for famous companies in the tennis industry such as: Alto, Maxima, Dunlop and Babolat. The evolution of Babolat from stringing to a racket company was possible thanks Luca Appino's ability in talent scouting.

For Babolat he selected various young and, at the time, unknown players, from 11 to 15 years old; five of them reached the #1 position in the ATP and WTA: Rafael Nadal, Andy Roddick, Kim Clijsters, Dinara Safina and Caroline Wozniacki.

After Babolat experience he was director for a year of Mouratoglou Tennis Academy in Paris.

In 2007, Luca received the PTR Industry Award for the results obtained in talent scouting and for the development of the tennis industry in general. In 2009, his first book : "The world of Rafael Nadal, secrets of his success", written in collaboration with Toni Nadal, was published in English, French and Spanish.

In 2008 Luca founded Tennis-Talents and implemented the TT Formula and TT Method; he led seminars and workshops around the world. During his coaching experience, Luca guided the Estonian player Kaia Kanepi from #60 WTA to #18 WTA ranking.

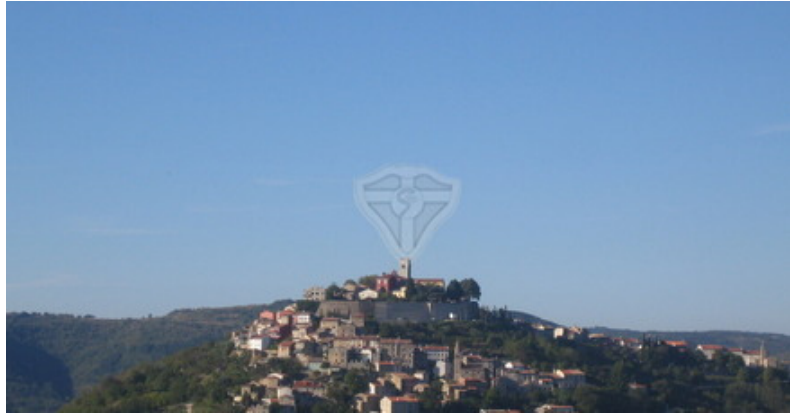
